#### 2009 PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS: CONSERVATION AND OUTREACH

Early summer of 2009

Was kicked off with a
celebration of the Burleigh
project which had closed
earlier in the year. This
project was initiated by the
Lewis Creek Association
and ultimately included

the Charlotte Land Trust, the Nature Conservancy and Vermont Land Trust. Through the generosity of the Burleigh family and numerous donors, as well as the work of the conservation groups, the project resulted in a conservation easement on 73 acres of farmland to the Vermont Land Trust and the sale of 123 acres of forestland to the Nature Conservancy, with public access to this section.

During the later part of 2009, CLT was pleased to assist the Nature Conservancy and the Vermont Land Trust with the final phase of the Raven Ridge project which will culminate in spring of 2010 with the creation of a 365-acre natural area preserve in Charlotte, Monkton and Hinesburg. The preserve will be open to public access. In addition to permanently protecting significant wildlife habitat and natural features, the preserve will provide wonderful trails, beautiful views of the lake. Adirondacks and Champlain Valley and educational opportunities for study of the site resources. The final fundraising push resulted in a strong response from Charlotters and others interested in the project. In these tough economic times, the commitment of Charlotters to the Raven Ridge project and to conservation in general is truly inspiring.

Late in 2009, Charles and Gwen Allmon donated 69 acres adjacent to the north slope of Mount Philo State Park to the State of Vermont. This parcel has sweeping views of the valley, Lake Champlain and mountains and will be a significant addition to one of Vermont's most popular state parks. Although CLT was not involved with the final closing, we began conversations about conservation with the Allmons a number of years ago and explored several options for protecting the property. We are very pleased and grateful to the Allmons for permanently protecting this land and providing such a wonderful gift to all who enjoy Mount Philo.

As these projects illustrate, CLT works not only on our own, but also in partnership with many organizations. This enables us to leverage a small, unstaffed land trust's efforts into significant and frequently complex projects. We are committed to exploring project partnerships and other tools that make us more effective since that also provides good value

Outreach and education have always been important parts of our mission. In addition to frequent and ongoing discussions with landowners about conservation options for their land we also provide information to Charlotters

We once again participated in the Charlotte Town Party with our booth. We prepared a list of local agricultural products for sale in Charlotte, with contact information on the vendors. The interesting diversity of products grown and produced in Charlotte is one more testimony to the important role of agriculture in our town and the importance of preserving it for years to come.

At the end of 2009 our longest serving board member, Betty Ann Lockhart, retired. Betty Ann has been a stalwart and tireless supporter of CLT and conservation in Charlotte. We can't thank her enough for her years of membership on the CLT board. Laura Crandall joined the board in January 2010 and brings a wide range of expertise (including experience as a farmer) to CLT. We look forward to working with her.

Art Burleigh was a longtime farmer in Charlotte and an active member of our community. Art passed away March 7, 2010, at the age of 90. His farm on Spear Street was conserved in 2009 and continues to be farmed by his son, Gary, and daughter, Sheia. Art cared deeply for his farm and was pleased to know that the open fields and woodlands would remain that way in the years to come. In honor and appreciation of his generosity and vision, as well as his stewardship of his land for many years, the board of the Charlotte Land Trust dedicates this year's annual report to Art.
